Mr. Turek reported that a test case had been expunded and that the process for the disciplinary action to be removed from the database, website, and HIPD took approximately 6 weeks. The staff will be working on expunging the remainder of the applicable cases in the coming months.

I. Discussion and possible action on adding new CHAPTER 348. PHYSICAL THERAPY LICENSURE COMPACT, pursuant to SB 317 addition of Subchapter K to Chapter 453, Occupations Code during the 85th Legislative Session.

Mr. Aikman reported that there are six (6) Compact member states whose licensees will be eligible to apply for practice privileges to other member states beginning April 1, 2018, including Texas. He also reported that there are several states that are having difficulty obtaining their Originating Agency Identification (ORI) Number from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) which will delay their licensees from being eligible to apply for practice privileges.

J. Discussion and possible action on proposing changes to §322.1. Provision of Services, regarding adding (f) Telehealth.

The Committee reviewed SB 1107 and the Texas Medical Board's recently amended rules on telehealth, and discussed the different provisions that should be included in rule pertaining to physical therapy intervention via telehealth. The Committee directed the PT Coordinator to solicit stakeholder input regarding whether or not a physical therapist assistant should be allowed to participate in telehealth and to prepare draft rules for telehealth for presentation at the next meeting.

K. Discussion and possible action on future meeting dates and agenda items.

The next committee meeting was set for April 12, 2018 in Austin with potential proposal of Rules amendments as indicated in Agenda Items D., E., F., G., H., I., and J.
